With much color and expression, artist <u>Hope Gangloff</u> brings her friends and family onto the canvas. The people and details are modern, but in terms of composition and technique, she refers to classical artists.

The portraits are deliberately flattened by making every part of the canvas equally important and detailed, a technique that we mainly know from painter Édouard Vuillard. The colors and poses used strongly remind of the portraits of Egon Schiele (although they were more explicit in nature).

Rock climber

In a recent interview with <u>Vogue</u>, Hope Gangloff compares himself with someone who climbs rock faces: "an outsider who does not look at art much can wonder why I always paint the same thing. But he or she probably does not see the smaller details. Just like rock climbers are always looking for places that are just a bit different from the rest. When I look at a painting, I look for a possible next step that I can take. For me, a painting is like a puzzle that I need to solve."
