MARCIA KURE

Nigeria-born Marcia Kure explores the change of identity and postmodern loss of certainties in her practice of art. Using techniques from drawing to photomontage, as well as sculpture, Kure critically responses to the present postcolonial condition, reconfiguring through normative fashion aesthetic, classic juvenile literature, African masking forms and children toys. Kure's works have been exhibited worldwide, including at the Paris Triennial in 2012 and the 7th Sharjah Biennale in 2005, and have been collected in several institutions including the British Museum and Smithsonian Institution.
