Now on view at the Landing, *The Rat Bastard Protective Association* is a group exhibition organized by Dr. Anastasia Aukeman, author of *Welcome to Painterland: Bruce Conner and the Rat Bastard Protective Association* (University of California Press, 2016). The Rat Bastard Protective Association (RBPA) was a community of artists who lived and worked together in the late '50s and early '60s in San Francisco's "Painterland"—the area in and around 2322 Fillmore Street. Upon his arrival to San Francisco in 1957, Bruce Conner established the RBPA, deriving the name from the combination of a local trash collection company—the Scavengers Protective Association—and a slur "picked up at the gym." The exhibition at the Landing is the first exhibition of work by the RBPA since 1958, when the group led a parade to their exhibition at San Francisco's Spatsa Gallery.

December 11, the Landing presents screenings of Robert Branaman's *Excerpts from The Fillmore Bus & other films* (c.1960), and Paul Beattie's *Scenes from Tap City Circus* (1960) featuring George Herms. Robert Branaman will be present at the screening. The evening will also include a live action reading of *The Beard* (1965), a play by Michael McClure, directed by Russ Tamblyn and starring Liz Nolan as Jean Harlow and Tyler Ritter as Billy the Kid.
